1. CALL TO ORDER..... 5 Minutes

 - a. **Hot Lunch Committee:**
 - i. Update on starting in January - Jessica Bley
 - ii. Ready to go for the first hot lunch on January 28th with The Pantry. They are going with a soup and bun (regular and gluten free buns) options for \$4.80 plus \$.50 juice box plus \$.50 for fee - total of \$6.00 lunch.
 - iii. Fees on Cash Online, Cherie was told 4% per transaction, but fees seem to have varied. Minimum of \$.50.
 - iv. Cadillac Kitchen will do taco Tuesday in March.

- vi. Jessica advised we will need approximately 4 or 5 volunteers for two lunch rotations. Cesalee will help if she is available. Most companies are able to deliver and Jessica will pick-up, as needed.

- i. Second Fiddle Dance Evening Update - Cassandra Litchfield
 - Cassandra had a call with Becky whose biggest concern is that this kind of function will not work if parents are not involved. Must have parents support and advertise in a way that this is a parent led event, a family function then it could be so much fun, but if you don't then it is a non-starter.
 - They would keep it very basic so young kids can follow along.
 - Alternative option, is a two hour dance with a playlist.
 - If you open it up to the public, some regulars will come and some families with children in ISS and CCHS as well as younger kids.
 - It is a charity donation, \$5 per person or \$10 per family and funds would go to the Parent Council with the funds going to the Parent Council.
 - Facility request form will be needed for a public event so that janitorial staff is available. A few volunteers would be required.
 - Gym would need to be cut in half, it's too big. Section off hallways, stairs, etc. String band would be on the stage and run it for an hour and start no later than 6:00 pm. We would need to pick a couple dates and go back to Becky. January or February would work. Cassandra will bring a potential date of February 13th to Becky and then update Alisha.
